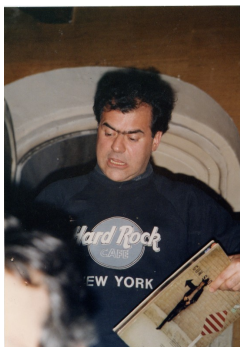


The Closing of Sandro's House in Rome

In early March 1993, before to close his house in Trastevere from where he had be evicted, Sandro Dernini organized an auction party, with Glauco Benigni and Angelo Forte playing the auctioners, to give out in sale all his historical memorabilia, before that he was moving to New York with his wife Maria Pia Marsala and their son Rodolfo Maria Dernini.

As symbolical continuation of the 1992 *Christopher Columbus Voyage in the Planet of Art*, the money earned from the auction he left to Metateatro for a multimedia implementation of the Polaroid group shot made that night with some many historical from since LIACA and Plexus time.

In April, in Sardinia, at the University of Cagliari, on the occasion of the Scientific Culture Week at the Cittadella dei Musei, as follow up the 1992 Well Being Columbus Reconciliation Forum, Franco meloni presented the project of *Well Being and Reconciliation Network, 1992-1996*, in which the *Plexus Black Box* was pointed out as the database framework.

In New York, in early May, at the office of the commissioner on Human Rights of the City of New York, Dennis de Leon, it was established the International Reconciliation and Well Being Committee by the USA participants at the 1992 Columbus Forum in Sardinia, with the purpose to organize in New York a second international well being conference on “Conflict, Reconciliation and Well Being at the Closing of the XXth Century”. Sandro Dernini was appointed conference scientific director and Mico Licastro was the conference director, with Dennis de Leon acting as chairman.

Around the same period, David Ecker invited Sandro Dernini to join him as NYU graduate assistant in the development of the NYU Lower East Side Graduate Summer Institute of Living Traditions in Art, a community-based urban art education project. It was articulated in two three week advanced courses. “*Living Traditions in Art*” course conducted by David Echer and “*Projects in Photography*” conducted by Mali Olatunji, photographer of the Museum of Modern Art and co-director of the Institute.

The focus of the Institute was on community-based collaborative efforts to devise urban art education strategies for the advancement of artistic and cultural traditions of the Lower East Side. It had also the purpose to bridge NYU with the Lower East Side community, on the issues of art, reconciliation and well being. It was presented as an international travelling community-based art education project, starting from the Lower East Side program and to be further developed internationally through “*The Voyage of the Elisabeth*”, as a continuing multimedia travelling art event made to raise up the visibility of the Institute’s activities addressed to the advancement of the living traditions in arts around the world. *The phenomenology in the Arts*” course was focused to engage students in current issues in multicultural and cross-cultural inquiry in the arts with an emphasis on developing qualitative research skills. It was followed by Sandro Dernini for his Ph.D. study. At the end of the course, it was held by the students in the art studio of the Barney Building a collective presentation of their field researches in the Lower East Side.

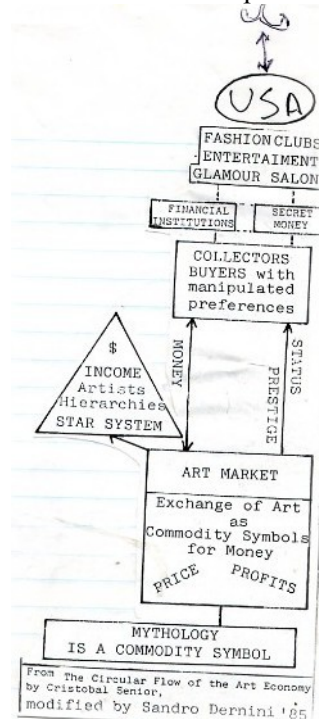

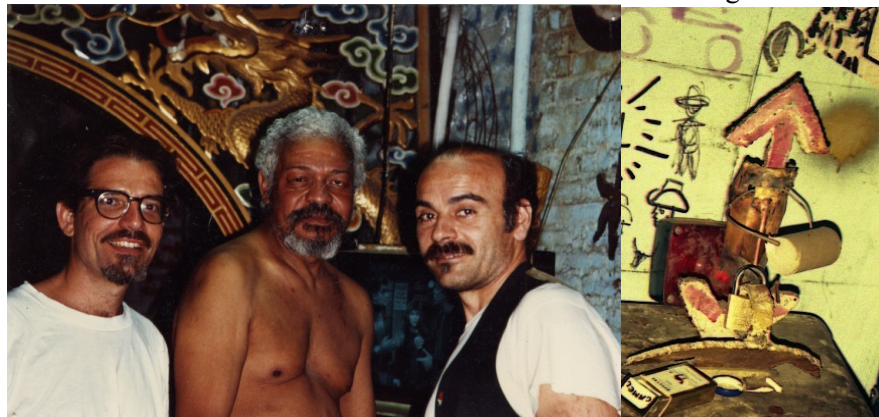

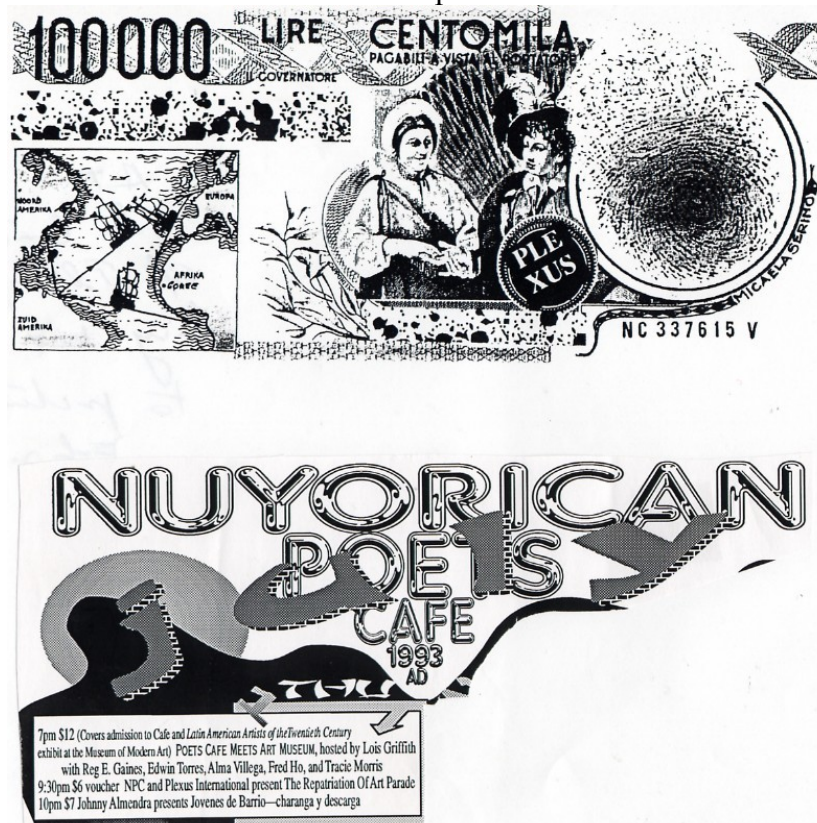

A copy of the poem *The Box* by Alfa Diallo was placed on top the retina. On the right wall, near the entrance it was placed the Metateatro boxing ring image, performed in many past Plexus events since 1988, with at its center the photo made in 1990, at the Teatro in Trastevere in Rome, in occasion of the symbolic delivery of "Plexus Black Box" to Mons. Dante Balboni. All around there were many other Plexus records and relics.



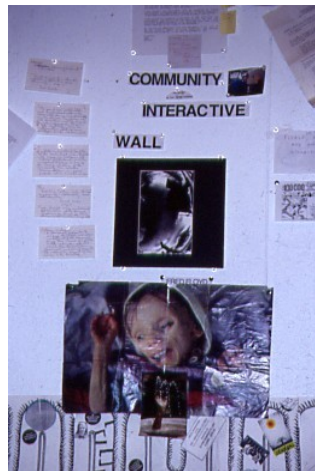
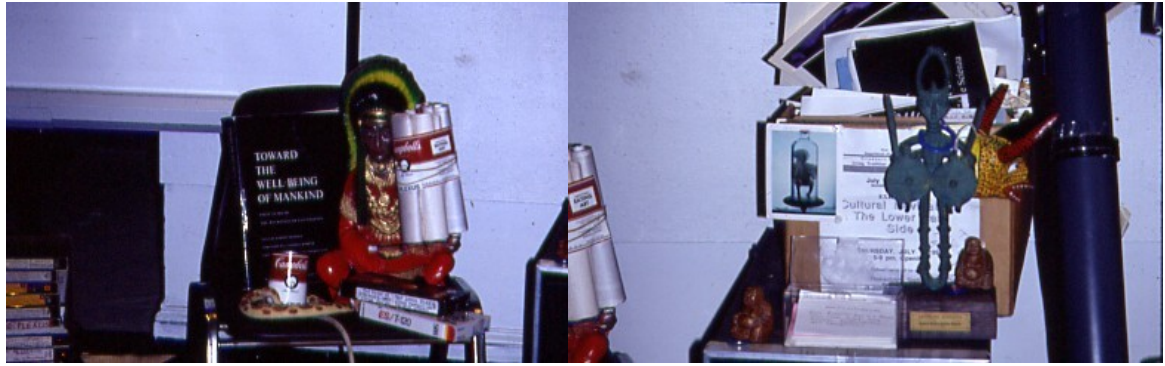
At the bottom of boxing ring, there was the dossier “prehistory”, the first of the 14 “Plexus Black Box” dossiers, that Sandro as student, following the model of David Ecker of the artist-researcher, made to document Plexus activities, one per each year, from 1982 to 1993, plus one for a Plexus pre-historia.

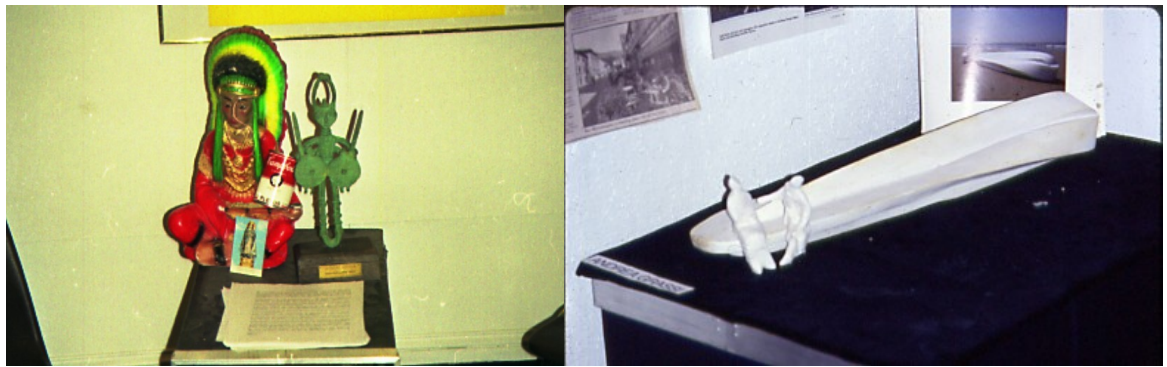
Next to it was made an art altar, with an earth mound on the floor, made by an icosaedron sculpture by Ray Kelly, inspired by Bucky Fuller, with inside a picture of the Rivington School before being shut down by the City of New York in early 1993, next to the Nuraghic Warrior sculpture which was buried in 1989 in the ground of Rivington School, and then recovered in June 1993, as part of Sandro’s field research for the Summer Institute.



This small installation served to display some Consent Forms for Research Activities Involving Human Subjects. The audience, to pass in the main room, had to pass through two cocoons sculptures reflecting life and death by Frank Pio.



The small copy of the black box floating sculpture by Ciriaco Ciriaco was suspended from the ceiling, above the American Indian statuette, placed next to a large amount of records and relics of Plexus activities.

Off center of this set there were two wood Buddha statuette, placed facing opposite sides, above the *Magic Box*, a sculpture by Aaron Barr.

At the right side of this second art altar, there was Eve Vaterlaus' *Homunculus* sculpture, showing a little man closed in a large bottle full of water.

From the opening day to the closing day, every day there was a full calendar of activities involving artists, community people and art students from the course "Current Issues in Art Education" in which both Frank Pio and Sandro were following as students.

The two weeks of Plexus events at the Rosenberg Art Gallery was a tentative to test the possibility to develop collaboration between NYU and Lower East Side community cultural and artists organizations, through the Nuyorican Poets Cafe, CUANDO Community Cultural Center, Rivington School, and Plexus International. It was very hard because of

the diversity of positions, from one side a close homogeneous institutional academic system and, to the other side, an heterogeneous community complex.

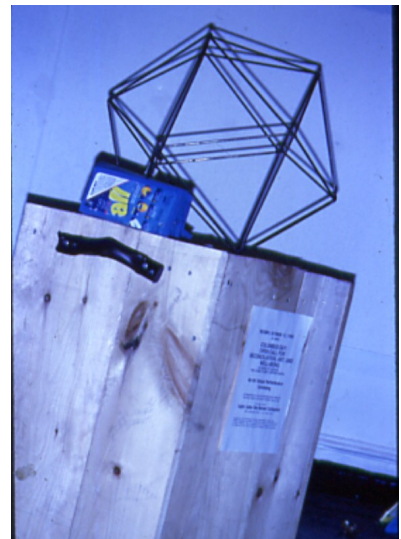
At the end of the two weeks a conclusion, Plexus records and relics were packaged into two boxes, overflowing inside and outside of them.
